

# Appendix I Actions, Priorities, and Program Descriptions

## A. Actions and Priorities

1. **Drop-Off Recycling:** SWMD has 34 Part-Time Rural Drop-Off opportunities. Twelve in Defiance County, three in Fulton County, eight in Paulding County and eleven in Williams County. Drop-Off trailers are the heart of the district's recycling priorities and will be a priority.
2. **School Recycling:** Defiance County has six schools; Fulton County has nine. Paulding County has five and Williams County has six. School recycling is also a requirement and a priority.
3. **Collection Services (Office Recycling):** Defiance County has twenty-nine locations with one ending this year. Fulton County has thirty-seven locations with fifteen removed. Paulding County has thirty-two locations with four removed. Williams County has three with one removed. This is a priority.
4. **Other residential recycling programs:** These specialized events meet the plans direction to provide opportunity to recycle 'hard to recycle items.' Hard to recycle items include HHW, electronics, e-waste, and tires. This is a priority in the plan.
5. **Contracting Assistance:** Contracts are sometimes necessary for counties to meet the requirements of the plan. The district allows each county to manage their recycling programs as designed to meet the plan and their county residents. Contracts play a crucial role, and the district feels this will remain a priority.
6. **Restricted/Difficult to Manage Wastes:** HHW, Scrap Tires and Electronics will continue to be a priority.
7. **Grants:** Grant Funding is normally available annually and should continue to be a resource as a supplement to district funding and for Market Development recycling opportunities to local businesses. This will continue to remain a priority for the district.

**Who is the target audience?** Village residents of Sherwood, in Defiance County and the village residents of Swanton, in Fulton County.

**Where is this program being offered?** Services are provided to the Villages of Sherwood and Swanton.

**What materials are being collected?** Cardboard, plastic, pressboard, magazines, paper, plastics, aluminum cans, and steel cans.

**Who provided/operated the program?** Sherwood is with a private hauler, Werlor's Waste Control and Recycling and the Village of Swanton is using Klumm Brother's Waste, a new provider to our district.

**Who pays for this program?** Residents are billed for this service by the provider.

**How is this promoted?** Websites for each private hauler as well as the Village website. The district office maintains the total infrastructure for the district and each PMCC also keeps apprised of private contracts within their county.

**Will SWMD continue with this existing program?** Non-Subscription Curbside translates to a community that contacts a hauler/recycler separately to pay for this service. The Village of Sherwood was misclassified in the last plan update and was recorded as a Subscription Service, it is a recommended service for the Village of Sherwood, and most residents do use the same provider. The Village of Swanton was recently added as non-subscription with Klumm Brothers offering recycling as well as waste. The SWMD does not have any involvement with this service but is of the understanding that this service will continue.

**Will this be a priority for the SWMD?** The district is aware that it has 2 (two) non-subscription curbside recycling opportunities. This is between municipalities and private haulers, the district does not feel this is a priority.

**Who is the target audience?** The City of Defiance and the Village of Hicksville residents are both in Defiance County, the Village of Archbold and Delta are residents within Fulton County, Villages of Blakeslee, Edgerton, Edon, Montpelier and Stryker, as well as the City of Bryan all target residents within Williams County.

**Where is this program being offered?** Service area as noted above.

**What materials are being collected?** Cardboard, plastic, pressboard, magazines, paper, plastics, aluminum, and steel cans.

**Who provided/operated the program?** The City of Defiance and the Village of Hicksville contract with Werlor' Waste Control and Recycling. The Village of Archbold and the Village of Delta contracts with Archbold Refuse Service (ARS). The city of Bryan, Village of Blakeslee, Village of Edgerton is contracted with Republic Services. The Village of Edon, Village of Montpelier and the Village of Stryker are contracted with ARS.

**Who pays for this program?** Residents of the cities and villages listed above.

**How is this promoted?** Municipalities request quotes on these services, contract the service and notify residents via utility bills, websites, or mailings. The district office maintains the total infrastructure for the district and each PMCC also keeps apprised of private contracts within their county.

**Will SWMD continue with this existing program?** Subscription Curbside recycling is a contract with a provider and municipality. The SWMD does not have any involvement but is of the understanding this service will continue during the planned update. The Curbside Service Provider may change as contracts may be renewed during the plan update.

**Will this be a priority for the SWMD?** The district recognizes it has 10 Subscription Curbside Recycling opportunities: two in Defiance County, one in Fulton County, zero in Paulding County and seven in Williams County. The district understands that Curbside Recycling is the best opportunity for all residents to recycle, however the municipality may not want to impose fees or create a contract for this service. The providers currently offering this service do so with a cost. The providers may have changed, which is the new start date for that service provider, not the date recycling began. As noted, most dates are in the early 1990's when our recycling programs began. The SWMD realizes curbside recycling is the most effective means to reach resident for recycling needs. However the District does not have any involvement with required contracts with municipalities and curbside recycling, so it does not feel this is a priority for the district.

Urban is classified as a city or village with a population exceeding 5,000.

**Who is the target audience?** Sims Metal Management is located within the City of Defiance limits as Triangular Processing is within the City of Wauseon.

**Where is this program being offered?** Locations listed above.

**What materials are being collected?** Sims Metal Management has containers for metals. Triangular Processing has multiple containers to collect cardboard, paper, steel cans, aluminum cans, newspapers and plastic bottles.

**Who provided/operated the program?** Sims Metal Management is a large corporation, and Triangular Processing is a 501c business.

**Who pays for this program?** Sims Metal Management offers containers free of charge to the public, located at two locations within the city limits. Triangular Processing offers drop-off recycling containers available 24/7.

**How is this promoted?** Websites with schedules and locations per each noted business. The district office maintains the total infrastructure for the district and each PMCC also keeps apprised of private contracts within their county.

**Will SWMD continue with this existing program?** Sims Metal Management will continue to offer containers, and Triangular Processing.

**Will this be a priority for the SWMD?** The district is aware that it has 2 (two) FT drop-off recycling opportunities. Sims and Triangular Processing offer 24/7 access to recycling containers. One in Defiance County that will continue during the planning period and one in Fulton County. This is between municipalities and private businesses, the district does not feel this is a priority.

The Fulton County Transfer Station is considered part-time as it is not open for a 40-hour work week.

**Who is the target audience?** Fulton County residents but will accept waste and recycling from other counties and states.

**What materials are being collected?** MSW waste, tires, appliances, and steel, for a fee.

**Where is this program being offered?** Wauseon Ohio in Fulton County.

**Who provided/operated the program?** Fulton County Public Utilities/Fulton County Commissioners.

**Who pays for this program?** Fulton County Public Utilities/Fulton County Commissioners.

**How is this promoted?** Fulton County website, EPA Transfer Station listing, The district office maintains the total infrastructure for the district and each PMCC also keeps apprised of private contracts within their county.

**Will SWMD continue with this existing program?** The Fulton County Transfer station will be operational during the planning period.

**Will this be a priority for the SWMD?** The SWMD has one part-time urban drop-off location in Fulton County. Fulton County manages this facility, and the district does not feel this is a priority.

Rural denotes populations less than 5,000.

**Who is the target audience?** The Villages of Archbold and Metamora are located within Fulton County. Kohart Recycling is in Paulding County but is located between the Village of Paulding and an unincorporated community of Broughton. Northwest Recycling and the Village of Pioneer is in Williams County but is not limited to whom they serve.

**Where is this program being offered?** Noted above.

**What materials are being collected?** Cardboard, plastic, pressboard, magazines, paper, plastics, aluminum and steel cans at the Village of Archbold and Pioneer. The Village of Metamora only accepts cardboard. Kohart Recycling and Northwest Recycling only accept metals.

**Who provided/operated the program?** Triangular Processing is currently contracted to provide containers at the Villages of Archbold and Metamora. Kohart Recycling and Northwest Recycling are privately owned companies. ARS manages the village of Pioneer.

**Who pays for this program?** Triangular Processing is contracted by Fulton County MRDD and Fulton County Utilities (Fulton County Recycling Program). NW Recycling and Koharts are privately owned and the Village of Pioneer contracts with ARS.

**How is this promoted?** Websites for each private company and the district office maintains the total infrastructure for the district and each PMCC also keeps apprised of private contracts within their county.

**Will SWMD continue with this existing program?** Full-time urban drop-off locations may be contracted by a different company, but the service will continue during the planning period.

**Will this be a priority for the SWMD?** The SWMD has five full-time rural drop-off opportunities, zero in Defiance County, two in Fulton County, one in Paulding County and 2 in Williams County. Providing full-time opportunities to recycle is a valid resource and will be promoted but not a priority.

The district understands that part-time drop-off trailers, set at strategic locations, provide the entire district area with recycling opportunities.

**Who is the target audience?** All four counties within the district: Defiance County, Fulton County, Paulding County and Williams counties. The district does not verify if the user is within the district and welcomes anyone, from anywhere to utilize this recycling opportunity.

**Where is this program being offered?** As noted above.

**What materials are being collected?** Cardboard, plastic, pressboard, magazines, paper, plastics, aluminum cans, and steel cans. Defiance also accepts Rx prescription bottles and CPU's, tablets, e-readers, and cell phones.

**Who provided/operated the program?** Those located in Defiance County are managed by Defiance County Environmental Services. Fulton County Utilities manages Fulton County Recycling Program and are currently contracted with Triangular Processing to operate this recycling program. Paulding County is managed by Paulding County WMEA and has a contract with Werlor's Waste Control and Recycling. Williams County is managed by the Williams County Health Department, who are contracted with WiltonKeck to operate this program.

**Who pays for this program?** Defiance County is funded by the District's distribution of funds to Defiance County Environmental Services. Fulton County is funded by the District's distribution of funds to Fulton County Utilities who manages the Fulton County Recycling Programs. Fulton County Utilities currently contracts with MRDD and with Triangular Processing. Paulding County is funded by the District's distribution of funds to Paulding County WMEA, who manages Paulding County's recycling program and contracts with Werlor Waste Control and Recycling. Williams County is funded by the District' distribution of funds to Williams County Health Department, who manages the Williams County Recycling Program and contracts with WiltonKeck.

**How is this promoted?** The Part-Time Rural Drop-Off Program is promoted on the District website, each individual counties website, on the District Facebook page and printed brochures with recycling schedules and information.

**Will SWMD continue with this existing program?** Yes, this program will continue with this plan update.

**Will this be a priority for the SWMD?** SWMD has 34 Part-Time Rural Drop-Off opportunities. Twelve in Defiance County, three in Fulton County, eight in Paulding County and eleven in Williams County. Drop-Off trailers are the heart of the district's recycling priorities and will be a priority.

The PMCC's per county within the district may implement whatever recycling programs align with their counties' needs. Paulding and Williams Counties elect to have special recycling events for HHW, electronics and tires.

**Who is the target audience?** Williams county's events are normally open to anyone. Paulding County is limited to those in Paulding County only.

**Where is this program being offered?** Williams County held the HHW event at the Williams County Fairgrounds, The electronics event was held at WiltonKeck in Bryan Ohio (2025) and at Edon Farmer's Co-op in Montpelier, OH (2024). The tire event was held at the Williams County Engineer's Office and on an additional day it was held at the Henry County Landfill. Paulding County events were held at the Paulding County Fairgrounds.

**Who provided/operated the program?** Williams County Health Department, American Paint and ERG Environmental Services offered HHW events in the spring and fall. Williams County also partners with WiltonKeck to provide opportunities to recycle electronics in the spring. Also, Williams County Health Department and the Williams County Engineers office had a tire recycling event with assistance from Henry County Landfill. Paulding County holds an annual HHW event in cooperation with ERG Environmental Services and a Recycling Round Up event in the summer. Christmas Light recycling is offered by Williams County Health Department as the collector with participation from other counties as well.

**What materials will be collected?** HHW events include corrosives, misc. cleaners and toxics, batteries, fluorescent lamps, PCB ballast, lithium batteries, propane tanks, clean sweep pesticides, aerosols, solvents, oil-based paint, latex paint, reactive oxidizers, smoke detectors, and fire extinguishers. Electronic recycling events include towers, laptops, office phones, printers, copiers, stereos, speakers, mouse, game systems, circuit boards, routers, small kitchen appliances, external hard drives, memory devices, modems flat panel monitors and TVs, DVD players, VCRs, ram, credit card machines, wire (Romex, extension cords, lights, electrical cords, etc.). The Recycling Round Up event accepted aerosol cans, oil-based paint, solvents, automotive fluids, pesticides, cleaners, fire extinguishers, latex paint, fluorescent bulbs, batteries, general electronics (anything with a plug) and microwaves.

**Who pays for this program?** Williams County Health Department utilized grant funding from the Ohio EPA to assist with the tire recycling event. The other events held by Williams County and Paulding County were paid for by the funds received from the district as part of the general recycling budget.

**How is this promoted?** County Websites, District Website, District Facebook Page, flyers, radio ads.

**Will SWMD continue with this existing program?** Williams County and Paulding county will hold various recycling events for their county constituents as needed.

**Will this be a priority for the SWMD?** These specialized events meet the plans direction to provide opportunity to recycle 'hard to recycle items. Hard to recycle items include HHW, electronics, e-waste, and tires. This is a priority in the plan.

The District understands that school recycling is a fundamental basic requirement for our plan and plan update.

**Who is the target audience?** All schools within the district.

**Where is this program being offered?** At the schools listed above.

**Who provided/operated the program?** Defiance County Environmental Services provides for this program and collects from every school district within the county on a weekly basis. Fulton County currently contracts with Triangular Processing to collect at the schools listed. Paulding County WMEA provides this program and Williams County Health Department contracts with WiltonKeck for this program.

**What materials are collected?** This includes cardboard, pressboard, newspaper, magazines, plastic bottles, steel, and aluminum cans. Special collections may include computer components and hardback books.

**Who pays for this program?** Each county is funded by the District's distribution of funds to each county to manage, fund and operate the required recycling programming.

**How is this promoted?** Schools are contacted each school season to explain the details of the recycle program (weekly pick-up date, items collected, how to have items prepped, containers).

**Will the SWMD continue this existing program?** School Recycling Program will continue during this planning period.

**Will this be a priority for the SWMD?** Defiance County has six schools; Fulton County has nine. Paulding County has five and Williams County has six. School recycling is also a requirement and a priority.

HHW waste is home generated special materials, or a post-consumer waste which qualifies as hazardous waste when discarded. It includes household chemicals and other substances for which the owner no longer has a use, such as consumer products sold for personal care, household cleaners and detergents, automotive care, pest control, animal care, light bulbs, batteries, and other purposes.

The EPA considers leftover household products that can catch fire, react, or explode under certain circumstances or that are corrosive or toxic as HHW. Products such as paints, cleaners, oils, batteries, and pesticides can contain hazardous ingredients and require special care when you dispose of them.

**Who is the target audience?** All concerned citizens within the district.

**Where is this program being offered?** Special events are held in Williams and Paulding Counties. The district’s HHW Resource Booklet of how to dispose of HHW materials in a safe manner is available to anyone upon request. Defiance and Williams Counties will accept Mercury during the working week hours.

**What materials are collected?** Events will post specifically what they are collecting. Williams and Defiance counties accept mercury year-round.
